The Spanish cooperation will multiply by 6 the amount of bilateral aid for SRH (based on 2004 bilateral aid). Through bilateral aid, the AECI (Spanish Cooperation Agency) will be implementing Health programmes in Central America and increase funding for the Vita Programme in Africa, including SRH, fight against transmittable and tropical diseases, primary health care and health systems strengthening. Regarding MDG6: the aid will be multiplied by 9.5 from 2004 to 2006. The major recipients will be Guinea Equatorial , Angola and Namibia
