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## SRHR in the work of European development NGOs

While the engagement of European Non-Governmental Development Organisations (NGDOs) on SRHR has improved, some NGDOs pay little attention to SRHR issues and the relevant MDGs (MDG3, MDG4 and MDG5). In the context of the EU's new aid architecture, in which ODA funds to SRHR are being mainstreamed within larger development instruments and country-owned strategies, it is useful for NGDOs to take into account the significance of SRHR issues for poverty reduction within the scope of their activities. By reviewing European NGDOs networks' programmes, policies and structures, this survey identifies existing weaknesses in regards to the integration of SRHR topics in a broader development discourse, and attempts to identify possible synergies, strategic alliances and future cooperation that could be beneficial towards mainstreaming the ICPD agenda.

Through a web-based desk review of CONCORD network members, we screened the respective programmes and policies of 20 European-wide networks as well as the membership of 24 national platforms, enabling us to draw a qualitative and quantitative snapshot of SRHR integration within the activities and functioning of European NGDOs.

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This analysis reveals that among the 20 selected European-wide networks, only 6 (30%) address the strengthening of SRHR as a distinct or main focus of their work. While 5 of the selected organisations do not integrate any aspect of SRHR within their development activities and poverty reduction strategies, the remaining 9 only deal with some aspects of SRHR issues, mainly HIV/AIDS and women's empowerment.

In regards to national platforms for NGOs, 11 out of 24 (46%) fully involve SRHR-dedicated organisations as their member (the Slovenian platform only addresses SRHR through a specific working group), making it clear that SRHR is far from being considered a cross-cutting issue within the European Development NGO community.

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## Philanthropic Giving to Population Assistance

A recent study by the European HIV/AIDS Funders Group found that total European philanthropic spending towards HIV/AIDS reached \$134 million in 2008, a decrease of \$2.5 million over the previous year. Two thirds of expenditures is currently funding projects and programmes outside of Europe, among which the largest share (34%) is destined for Eastern and Southern Africa. HIV/AIDS research remains the greatest recipient sector of philanthropic spending, while advocacy is among the least. Regardless of the economic and financial crisis, most organisations surveyed expect an increase in their HIV/AIDS-giving in 2009. Information on spending towards sexual and reproductive health or population assistance exclusive of HIV/AIDS is not available due to a continued lack of reliable data.
